CCS invites proposals from leading researchers and practitioners for 90-minute tutorials on the state of the art in an area of security. Speakers should be considered leading experts and authorities on the proposed topics. Tutorials should be aimed at an advanced audience, but audience members should not be considered experts in the specific topic. Topics should be of current interest to the security community and offer opportunities for sustained interest in the near future.

To submit, please send a brief proposal to the Tutorials Chair, Rebecca Wright, at ccs05-tutorials@cs.stevens.edu. The proposal should include the title, a brief description of the topic (no more than half a page), and a brief bio of the speaker. In addition, the proposal should include either a URL or an attachment with more detailed information about the speaker's professional qualifications. Submission indicates intent of the speaker to present the tutorial at CCS-12, if accepted for presentation. CCS will pay a modest honorarium to the speaker, but the speaker is responsible for all travel and other arrangements. Registration for the conference is not mandatory but is highly encouraged.
